TRAFFIC STOP -- Deputies on patrol in the 7000 block of North State Street stopped a car at about 12:30 a.m. Monday for a vehicle code violation and arrested a 48-year-old Ukiah woman for allegedly being under the influence of a controlled substance, possessing prescription pills that weren't hers and having a syringe in

her purse. She was booked at the county jail under \$10,000 bail.

BATTERY -- Deputies responded to the 19000 block of South Harbor Drive in Fort Bragg at about 5:30 p.m. Monday for a reported battery. They found Santa Rosa resident Lester Elmore, 47, unconscious. Elmore was taken to the Mendocino Coast District Hospital for treatment.

Deputies learned that Jeffrey Graham, 37, allegedly punched Elmore with a closed fist, rendering him unconscious for "a significant period of time" and giving him a laceration-type injury on the outside and inside of his mouth.

Graham left the scene in a car and was reportedly headed to Kelseyville. Deputies arrested him a short time later near Willits. Graham was booked at the county jail on suspicion of battery with serious injury under \$30,000 bail.

BOOKED -- Dennis Patrick Cronin, 59, of Fort Bragg, was booked at the county jail at 8:54 p.m. Monday on suspicion of driving under the influence and driving with a blood-alcohol level greater than the legal limit. The state Department of Parks and Recreation arrested him.
